Public Comment	Amy Phillips topic: Climate Change
	Citizens Climate Lobby - nonpartisan grass roots group trying to get congress to pass nonpartisan legislation.
	Intense focus on a solution - Why is it important to a school. Concerned about removing climate change from science and school teachings. Citizens flooded legislators with comments about removing science standards.
	Important to education - equating climate change to guns in school. Guns get more attention and climate change needs to have as much attention.
	CCL has proposal 'Carbon Fee and Dividend'. All parties are supportive.
	Market driven, revenue neutral - Key words for all those who don't like anything that smells like big

federal bureaucracies. Not a tax. Equal numbers of Rep and Dems supporting this. Environmental groups supporting this as well.

Best hope of getting movement on changing thought about climate change.

Asking for an endorsement from FBCS to add weight to situation. (Is LPOSD endorsing?) Would like us to endorse the Carbon Fee and Dividend proposal.

Jodi and Jason Giddings - school safety

School security. Worry about safety of kids and how someone could walk in with a gun. Support armed security for schools.

Idaho allows school boards to make the decision about armed security. Asking school to consider armed security.

Armed security everywhere we go, so why not schools. School in Florida is deputizing staff who volunteer as well as school in Texas. Staff must be extensively trained including mental health in partnership with the sheriff.

School shootings need to stop - school staff are first responders. Signs out front saying "armed staff', bullet proofed glass, special door locks, metal detectors, mace, etc.

ALICE - Alert, lockdown, inform, counter and evacuate.

Jodi is a national blogger and knows a lot about the top. Jason is working on inventing bullet proof walls that can retrofit to existing walls.

Mary Jensen responded security concerns with what FBCS is and will be doing.

Updating phone systems - New phone has PA system and direct connection to dispatch with video feed. Other security systems can be added on to this system. Has an alarm to let kids know it is a lockdown, put in every single room and common areas.

Admin and staff will know the code. Ryan is ordering and will install as soon as it gets here.

Buzzer system to allow people to enter school. Will have a PA as well as a video so everyone will be seen before they enter. Now everyone is able to enter without notice

Side doors in middle school. Alarm system on the middle school doors - since doors often don't close. Alarm will go off until the doors are completely shut. All doors are checked regularly and there is really only one door in the front for entrance and exit. All handles on outside and surrounding doors have been taken off.

We expect to continue this conversation.

Calendar adoption

Need to adopt calendar for the school. Planning committee worked on calendars. - presented a 4-day calendar, semester vs trimester, decided to stay with the trimester. If the waiver goes away then we would revisit the trimester vs semester because school year would go from August 1 to June 30

Mary called state and we have a waiver for the next two years. Calendar has tried to mirror spring breaks with LPSOD/NIC as well as end of school. Graduation June 9.
